From the June Board Meeting.....

There were 12 members present at the *June 9th* Board Meeting held at the North Carroll Senior Center. A request for a donation from the Carroll County Farm Museum for their "Giant Pumpkin" event in October was read. Lion Andy, with a second from Lion Larry made a motion to honor their request for a \$20 donation. The motion passed.

Lion Joe reported that the work nights at the pool were a great help in getting the pool ready for Opening Day. He thanked everyone for their help. A local electrician has made many upgrades to the lighting around the building and pool and will be installing a speaker system in the coming weeks. A difibulator has been ordered and we need to purchase a new NSF approved freezer for the concession stand.

Lion Joe also reported that there have been over 5,000 hits on the club's web site with people checking out the pool and other information about the club. He thanked Lion Scott Stone for the great job he has done to keep the site current.

Lion George reported that he has collected 65 pairs of used eye glasses so far this month. He also reported that he recently collected \$55.65 for the aluminum cans that the club recycles.

Lion Andy reported that he and Lion Steve turned in \$302 at the recent White Cane Banquet that the club recently collected for White Cane Days at Miller's Food Market.

Lion Joe reported that the club made a profit of \$1,150 for the Memorial Day Scholarship Walk in memory of Catherine Anne Mullikin. He mentioned that there were several large donations made to the scholarship fund. The Manchester Maniacs 4-H club donated \$250; Mr. & Mrs. Mullikin donated \$150; and *Catherine's Cause* donated \$500. Mullikin Memorial Scholarship was won by Miss Caitlin Bach. Congratulations to all. Next year the club will be awarding scholarships to the new Manchester Valley High School.

Lion Andy reported that the club sold 13 brooms and 32 raffle tickets at Manchester Day – a new record.

Lion Micki reports that the club made a \$289 profit at the recent New Windsor Savings Bank Grand Opening fund raiser. We also sold \$55 in raffle tickets.

Board members decided to have a regular meeting at the pool on *July 21st* at 6:00 PM and a regular meeting at the NCSC on *August 4th* at 7:00 PM. The club's Annual Picnic will be *August 18th* at 6:00 PM. Lion Larry will invite the Manchester Town Officials and Police

Department and the NC Police Auxiliary. Lion Christy will invite the 4-H club and their parents.

Incoming President Fran will decide where and when the club board meetings will take place once she takes office. Lion Andy mentioned that he has scheduled DG Richard Liebno for his official visit on *September 1st* at Manchester.
