Ms. Lauren Hickey, Community Relations Officer with 'Right at Home' in home care and assistance made an excellent presentation. She discussed several services they provide to help keep seniors at home to live independently, live securely and to live joyfully. They provide many Companionship and Personal Care Services. They can run errands, do laundry, prepare meals, medication reminders, etc. They are available 24 hours a day. Their strategy is to get to know each client and create a specialized care plan based on individual needs. They have offices in Frederick and Westminster and can be reached at (410) 871-9804.

Lion Carol mentioned that our club Peace Poster winners are on display at the North Carroll Public Library.

Lion Larry reported that he has installed an Indoor/Outdoor Thermometer in the chemical room basement at the pool to better keep track of the temperature. He also mentioned that Lion Don has installed insulation over the basement door which should help to keep the room warm.

Lion Carol reported that the club had no entries for the American Heritage Essay Contest this year. Lion Carol recommended that the club consider an adult category as suggested by LCI for next year. The board members present all agreed.

Lion Steve made a motion that the club donates \$25 to MCC-Special Olympics Maryland to help sponsor Lion Joe and his daughter Caitlin in the Polar Bear Plunge. There was a second by Lion Chuck and the motion was approved.

Lion Andy made a motion that the club donates \$50 to the Hailey's Wish Foundation when Mrs. Brigitte Miller makes her presentation at the February 3rd meeting. There was a second by Lion Christy and the motion was approved.

Lion George is a Past District Diabetes Chairman and he and his daughter both are Type I diabetics.

Type I, also known as Juvenile Diabetes, is a life-long commitment. Daily doses of insulin and testing are the norm. Type II diabetes usually strikes at middle age and can usually be controlled with medication, exercise and diet. Diabetes is the 7th leading cause of death. Lion George asked that Lions support the District Kiss-A-Pig Contest and also Camp Merrick – both are important to the district and to our communities. Lion George offered to test the blood sugar of several members and explained his insulin pump and sensor. He asked everyone to please educate yourself and call him if you have questions or concerns.

Lion Cindy said she will be picking up the Scholarship forms at NCHS in the near future for the committee to make their selections. Lion Cindy also made a motion that the Catherine Mullikin Memorial Scholarship be raised to \$1,500 - \$1000 from the club and \$500 from Catherine's Cause. After a second by Lion Ron, the motion was passed.

Lion Larry mentioned that the Manchester Activities Building has been reserved for March 27th and that Willow Tree Press will be printing and donating the tickets.

Lion George reported that he took the aluminum cans for recycling and received \$48 for them. He also has 227 pairs of eye glasses that will be turned in at the District Meeting.
